APPROVED MINUTES BOARD OF GOVERNORS MEETING May 6, 2003

The Commodore called the meeting to order at 7:40 p.m.

Commodore's Opening Remarks

The commodore stated that he had not received any changes to the agenda and that the agenda to be used for the evening would be the one submitted as a draft in the May issue of *The Clew*.

Treasurer – The Treasurer reported that our financial situation is good. As of May 5 we have \$20,844 in checking (not counting the income presented to Jim at the meeting) and \$51,807 in our money market account.

Vice Commodore – The Vice Commodore was not in attendance. Don Behrens reviewed the SMSA calendar with the BOG.

Race – The Race Governor was not in attendance.

Cruise – The Cruise Governor reported that the first 2 cruises were not well attended--probably due to the poor weather.

Junior – The Junior Governor reported that there are 2 high school regattas during May. They are the JV Regatta on May 10 and the Sea Scouts Regatta on May 31.

- The Sailing Camps are moving along well. All Opti Camps are filled with a waiting list. Next year we may want to consider getting more Opti's.
- The FJ Camps have 13 in each camp so we are breaking even.

Women's – The Women's Governor reported that the women's program is right on schedule with 2 more seminars this month.

Rear Commodore – The Rear Commodore had no report.

Social – As the Social Governor will be arriving late; Don Behrens noted that the only item that Laura asked him to report on her behalf was that the Luau plans are on track for Saturday, May 31 at 4:00 p.m.

Facilities – The Facilities Governor reported that our chart has been framed and hung and it looks great. Carl also reported that we will indeed build a new bar and he is looking for volunteers for the project (LCYC has volunteered to help).

Publicity – The Publicity Governor reported that he mailed about 90 yearbooks for a cost of about \$350. He also mailed the Grisso's yearbook to their daughter in California. Ruth Keimig was given extra copies that she delivered to the other Grisso children. Tim would like to update the SMSA brochure and start distributing it. The BOG thanked Tim for a great yearbook. Walt thanked Lisa Flaherty for helping to distribute them.

Membership – The Membership Governor reported:

- Opening day sold \$84 worth of pins, decals, and replacement burgees.
- Two new membership applications this month:
 - Family membership for Alan Rothberg and Mary Ann Griffith.
 - Rejoin family membership for Brian and Linda Hoffman.

Motion: Membership Governor moves to approve the Rothberg new membership application.

Results: Seconded and unanimously passed.

Walt asked Rod how many members we had last year. His answer was 208 – 13 of which are juniors. Our membership count right now is 205 with juniors.

P&PC Issues Review Status - Jan Buckler said that she would have a P&PC status report by the June BOG meeting.

Report from Capital Planning Committee – Carl Feusahrens reported that his requirements committee meeting would be Wednesday at 7:30 p.m. at the clubhouse.

SMSA Web Site Update Status – Tim reported for Dan Shannon. Dan has sent an email to the BOG members with sites for us to look at. These sites are for developing a member's only forum. There is also a free site on Yahoo that he encouraged the BOG to review. There was a discussion about SMSA commissioning a professionally designed website. Tim said he would look into gathering bids and proposals to bring before the BOG. Discussion followed on what features are needed. Tim will convene the Publicity Committee to discuss what we want on a new site.

BOG Tasking – Each governor will send an email to Tim with ideas for the website that would help his individual program. Negatives are required.

BOG Special Meeting, Purpose: alignment of individual programs with SMSA goals and mission statement – Don Behrens reported on the pros and cons for holding a special meeting. Discussion followed with several BOG governors expressing their concerns over what this meeting would accomplish.

CMM Coordination and Support Progress – Women's Program Governor – Calvert Marine Museum (CMM) would like to sponsor a community program consisting of families building dinghies/sailing dinghies on week-ends starting Spring 2004. FACILITIES GOVERNOR

Capital Planning Committee Report

Stovy Brown's Site Search Committee met with John Weir's Requirements committee on May 13 to review the clubhouse plan currently under development.

The plan includes moving the current clubhouse to a site in Calvert Marina near "G" dock, procurement of "G" dock and procurement of property for the house, parking and boat storage. The Requirements Committee agreed that the plan addressed each of the requirements contained in last year's requirements document. Based on that agreement, the Site Search committee will continue its efforts to obtain price estimates and to prepare a final cost estimate to give to Jim Keen's Finance Committee so that it can come up with a plan to finance this proposed effort.

The future tasks for the capital planning committee include:

- By July 1 - Assemble cost estimates
- In early July - present plan to Finance Committee
- In late July - with Finance Committee, settle on best financing option
- On Tue, Aug 5 - Present plan to BOG
- During Aug - Present plan to various SMSA committees and groups as requested

- On Tue, Sept 2 - Present plan with revisions to SMSA BOG
- On Sun, Sept 7 - Present plan to membership at Annual Meeting
- On Thu, Oct 2 - BOG approves 60-day cycle (15 October-15 December 2003) for membership approval of clubhouse plan.

RACE

The participation in the race program has been good and continues to grow. I am still receiving new entries and there are already an additional 8 paid entries over last year. I hope that with some additional buzz around the docks, that there will be more entries to come. Certainly, the more the merrier, so the encouragement of boats to participate that are close in rating to your own boat will make for more interesting and fun racing. Let's all try to get another boat out, either on Wednesdays or weekends.

There have been several issues in the race program that needs some tweaking. The coordinates in the Race Circular on page 45 for setting mark "X" for Wednesday Night Racing are wrong. The bearings listed on page 45 are correct for "X", so along with the Lat/Long coordinates listed on the chart on page 54 the mark can be set in the prescribed position. If "X" on Wednesday Night can't be set at the prescribed position, please make sure you as RC provide the Race Governor and the Scorer with the Lat/Long position of the mark and details on the score sheet to show how the distance was determined to score the race.

Another situation was brought to my attention. When laying out a course, other than on Wednesday night, and a listed Solomons Area Race Mark (page 54 and 55) is to be used as a turning or finishing mark, then that mark's label (A, B, E, etc.) should be used to describe the course. If an inflatable ball is set as the starting line

pin, then it would be labeled as “X” if it is to be used later in the course as a turning or finishing mark. I thank all RC’s and racers for taking the time to read the Race Circular, having the patience with each other to allow for a healthy and growing sailing experience.

June brings another month of great sailing on the Bay and beyond. Best wishes for those SMSA members that are racing to St. Mary’s City, Newport, Block Island, and even Germany. I’m looking forward to hearing how those participating away have fared. See you on the race course.

WEEKEND CRUISE TO BATTLE CREEK, April 26-27

A Ship Trip for Boaters

In April, we had occasion to leave *Quintet's* spring commissioning behind to take a trip entirely by water across Europe. Grand Circle and other tour companies offer a trip from Vienna to Amsterdam entirely aboard a 324-foot river ship. The trip goes up the Danube River, through the Main-Danube Canal, and into the Rhine River. Daily ports of call provide opportunities ashore for guided tours, shopping, and (of course) drinking good German Pilsner or wines. While a lot different from bare boating on canals, this is nonetheless an enjoyable two weeks of being waited on hand and foot. This is certainly an easier trip that Tristan Jones recounted in his book *Outward Bound!* Early and late season prices are not unreasonable. A search online for River Trips or Grand Circle will yield appropriate websites.

JUNIOR PROGRAM

SMSA Optimist Dinghy Racing Program – 2003

New to this year's Junior program will be a focus on racing. This will include the opportunity for

some of our juniors to race International Optimist Dinghies at regattas around the Chesapeake Bay. This program will be linked to our optimist camps, and Junior Sunday racing.

SMSA will sponsor the Opti racing team at Chesapeake Bay Yacht Racing Association (CBYRA) regattas around the Chesapeake Bay. Junior sailors who have enrolled in one of the Opti summer camps or who are SMSA family junior members are eligible for selection to this team. Sailors will be evaluated during the camps and at Junior Sunday racing sessions.

SMSA will award the Optimist Trophy to the best Optimist racer based on performance at races at SMSA and at other sailing clubs around the Chesapeake Bay. The SMSA Junior High Point Trophy is awarded to the best overall SMSA Junior racer for the season.

Sunday Junior racing will be offered to provide a less formal opportunity for juniors to race than at Chesapeake Bay Yacht Racing Association (CBYRA) races around the Bay. These race results will count toward the Optimist Trophy and will be used to select the SMSA Optimist racing team that will compete at CBYRA regattas this summer. Sunday races will be held at the swale from 3 p.m. to 5 p.m. **Dates:** June 8, June 22, July 13, July 27, August 10, and August 24.

The SMSA Junior Optimist camp program will consist of one-week sessions of training. Each week will be a separate sailing session. The basic sailing will follow the US Sailing/Red Cross basic sailing curriculum. Each week of sailing is independent, that is, a student may attend any number of the sessions. The camps are open to children age eight and older. Additional sessions may be added if demand justifies them.

This year, more emphasis will be given to racing Opti's during the camp. Sailors interested in more formal racing should make their interest known to the Instructor, and should plan on attending Junior Sunday racing. Sailors interested in CBYRA racing

should consider attending all the Sunday racing sessions to obtain valuable racing experience in a more informal setting than they will find at the regattas at other sailing clubs.

Spring Cleaning Hints

Is it getting hard to see through your dodger's plastic windows? Here's an idea from friend Ken Mowbray that I've used with considerable success – sandpaper!

Begin with a solvent, such as alcohol or paint thinner. Dampen a cloth and rub the plastic to remove deposits



that may have clouded the window. While I haven't tried ordinary thinner, I have used hardware-store strength alcohol and Interlux 211 solvent. They don't dissolve the plastic. Then, lightly rub abraded spots with VERY FINE 1500 grit sandpaper (AKA polishing cloth). Use persistence and lightness of touch rather than heavy elbow grease here. The result of sanding will be a frosty look, like the side of a Gilbey's Gin bottle. Finally, apply a plastic window polish such as Meguiar's, or even Brasso. Deep scratches may require repeat treatment of sanding and polishing.

By the way, I've found that using Meguiar's or a hardware-store strength Scotch Brite pads (much more abrasive than the ones on kitchen sponge pads) will remove the bright finish of stanchions, pulpits, and the frames for dodgers and bimini tops – these materials are too abrasive for the relative soft stainless steel used to make them. Brasso also works ok here.
