The 2003 Annual Meeting is now history and the election results have established the composition of the BOG for the 2004 administrative and operational year. September 2, 2003**

The Commodore called the meeting to order at 7:40 p.m.

Commodore's Opening Remarks

- Meeting expectations by Walt. He requested that in order to keep the meeting within a reasonable length of time, that we limit the meeting topics to the conduct our normal course of business and the preparation of the agenda for the business meeting. As a result, the discussion surrounding our Mission Statement development will be delayed until the next BOG meeting.
- Because Jan Buckler is not present, we are unable to present any data from the P&PC reports.
- Walt requested that the BOG members indicate whether or not any other changes to the agenda are needed. No replies from BOG. Walt then made a motion to accept the agenda as modified. Motion was seconded and motion passed.

Treasurer – Financial Report presented by Jim.

- Jim went through line items for each governor in the hopes of identifying each program's windfalls and shortcomings.
 - Zahnizers still owes a Sponsorship Fee for the Wednesday Night program. Discussion ensued about sending an invoice to Z's office to initiate payment.
 - Jim indicated that he got a letter from the State of Maryland Comptroller indicating that we do owe for penalties and interest for tax years 1999, 2000 and 2001 totaling \$945.00. He paid it.
 - Also, we've received a letter from the IRS indicating that 2001 Federal taxes were paid late, and that SMSA owes \$3,600 in late fees and interest. Jim wrote a letter back to the IRS with copies of the two extension requests that our former CPA, Dan Long, filed last year. Hopefully IRS will realize their mistake and retract the penalties/interest claim.
- Vice Commodore** – The Vice Commodore asked if there were any changes to the September, October,

and November calendars. The only change noted was the location for the Halloween Cruise, which will be at Rollins Cove.

Race - The Race Governor reported the statistics on this year's racing to date. Participation is up over previous year. Wednesday night participation is up 24% on different boats that have participated.

Wednesday night philosophy was to get more boats to earn more points. He will compile more statistical data for the annual business meeting. He also reported that the race committee boat has a bad rudder system.

Cruise – The Cruise Governor reported that 17 boats participated in the race/cruise to Battle Creek. He also reported the cruise to Annapolis was lots of fun even though it was very hot. Only 3 boats signed up for the 3-week cruise to Long Island Sound. With bad weather anticipated for the trip down Delaware Bay, they may have changed their destination.

Junior – The Junior Governor reported that the summer sailing camps had 92 juniors participate. He also reported that he received 47 new membership applications for junior membership. This means there were no non-members participating the summer sailing camps.

Women's – The Women's Governor has resigned.

Rear Commodore – The Rear Commodore had no report.

Social - The Social Governor reported there were 35 crab eaters at the crab feast. She also reported that the people in the Geezer-Squeezer were very nice. She also said the plans for the Annual Business Meeting on Sunday are all in order.

Facilities – The Facilities Governor reported that the clubhouse was being well taken care of by the users. He would like volunteers for a work crew on Saturday around 1300 to do several things around the clubhouse.

Public Relations - The Public Relations Governor reported that the online web forum is almost complete. He needs to become familiar with the program since he will be the administrator.

Membership –

- The Membership Governor reported he would have statistics for the annual business meeting.
- Rod also reported that he received one rejoin and one new membership application for consideration. The rejoin is Phil and Michele Brennan and the new

membership application is for John and Katherine Brodie who are being sponsored by Dave Pedersen.
