Columbus Day Cruise to Oxford Set For October

Please join *Njord* for an October 10, 2005, cruise to Oxford MD. Oxford is one of our favorite destinations and Columbus Day will be the last chance that we get to cruise there this year. Previous Columbus Days have produced a variety of weather and this year will be no exception.

The route from the Patuxent River is rather straight forward. After rounding Red # 4 at Drum Point, head on a course of approximately 060 M until you reach Green # 77. Head north on a course of 005 M for about 7.8 nautical miles. You should be able to see Green # 3 and Red Nun #4 to starboard. Head on a course of about 051 M until you reach

Red #10 being careful not to find the shoal water that was once Sharps Island. Once you round Red # 10 head on a course of 089 M for about five miles until you see Green Day Marker # 1 on a pole. Turn north from here and you will be off the Oxford Strand in about one mile. In all, it is 30 something nautical miles from Drum Point.

I will choose an anchorage once I have an idea of how many boats plan on attending. We usually anchor on the port side of Town Creek just past Green Day Marker #9. There is only room there for three boats so, if more boats attend I will build the raft off of the Strand. After happy hour we will break up the raft. There are several places to anchor on both sides of the Tred Avon River. We can discuss our options for the night and the next day during happy hour.

I will propose three options for Sunday's activities for you to consider. 1.) A lay-day in Oxford. 2.) Take a walking tour of Oxford and then cruise to St. Michaels or 3.) cruise to the Little Choptank. It is only about six miles to St. Michaels and about 15 miles to the Little Choptank.

The caveat to this itinerary is, if the weekend weather looks bad, then we will alter the destination to Saint Leonard Creek. Therefore, it is important to let us know if you will be attending. I will make the final decision on the morning of Saturday, October 10 once I feel comfortable with the forecast. However, contacting me the week prior to the cruise would be a good idea. You can reach me at 703-765-6893 in the evenings, 703-583-3812 during the weekdays. Leave a message if I am not in and I will return your call. On October 10, the day of the cruise, you can reach us on channel 9 VHF or cell phone 703-405-9082. We hope to be underway by 1000 hours and will try to monitor channel 9 throughout the day. It is difficult for us to hear the radio when we motor so if you don't get us try the cell phone. Hope to see you.
