DRAFT MINUTES BOARD OF GOVERNORS MEETING APRIL 5, 2001

OFFICERS AND GOVERNORS PRESENT:

Meeting called to order at 7:40.

Secretary- The minutes from the March meeting were approved as they appeared in *The Clew*.

Treasurer- David presented a 2001 budget progress by quarter through March 31, 2001. This report will be included in the original of these minutes. David addressed the issue of how Screwpile money may be spent- it may be used for expenses. It may not be used to reduce membership fees (or to preclude an increase) because that is a

benefit to individuals, as opposed to the organization.

Past Commodore- Frank King presented a schedule for the Opening Day Flag Ceremony.

Facilities- Dan Schneider was not present. Jeff Kumke reported that LCYC fixed the flagpole. Clean-Up day went well. Matt Gambrell has been informed of a large dead tree limb and will arrange its removal. Walt reported that he and Gail Goode were here to present a GPS seminar and found the clubhouse dirty with mud tracked on the floor. He would like a logbook for use of the clubhouse. He would like to suggest to Dan that the combination be changed.

Social Governor- Sandy reported that preparations for Opening Day are underway.

Publicity Governor- Karen was not present. She sent word that the yearbooks are complete and will be handed out on Opening Day.

John Herbig made a motion to accept these applications, seconded by Sandy Leitner. The motion was approved by a voice vote.

Race Governor- Shawn Stanley reported that the RC boat is in the water. Bottom paint was donated by Woolsey. He is looking for someone to donate a small amount of bottom paint for the bay race marks. The river race marks are ready to go.

Shawn will be using a cannon as a starting signal this year. He will be more than happy to show anyone interested on Opening Day.

The Spring Frostbites were very successful with a good turnout for every race.

The West Basin race mark will be moved to deeper water. Be aware, there are fish traps at "5". John Herbig made new flags for the river race marks.

Cruise Governor- Walt Rupp reported that Brigadoon will not be ready for the Opening Day cruise. Jay Hanks volunteered to lead this cruise.

Junior Governor- John Herbig reported that the sign-up for junior programs went well. The Nautical Flea Market raised \$76.25 from donations, concessions and items bought and sold. John says everyone left with something. The safety boat has been repaired and is running well. There are still a few openings for the summer camp.

Women's Governor-Gail Goode thanks Walt Rupp for his help with the GPS seminar. The Marcy Series is coming up in June. There was some discussion of a rule change allowing male owners on board their boats, but Gail will keep the rules the same for now, with a possible reconsideration for the Fall Women's Series.

The Coast Guard Auxiliary started a basic sailing class on Saturday, with 12 pupils.

Rear Commodore- Paul Eubank has the Yacht Clubs of America book with a listing of all member clubs. He will make it available to anyone interested.

Vice Commodore- Bill Moessner is still cruising.

Commodore- Jan Buckler reported that Amy Ironmonger placed in the top ten on the Bay in the Mobjack Nationals. She invites all governors to form their committees and use your volunteers. Get them involved.

There will be a policy and planning committee meeting on Tuesday, April 10. The topics include the clubhouse, dues, land, building, investing and the future. Jan thanks the officers and governors of the BOG for doing a good job.

Unfinished Business- The SMSA charter boat maintenance plan was presented by John Herbig. Walt Rupp made a motion to approve the implementation of the Charter Agreement between SMSA and SMSF. Shawn Stanley seconded. John Herbig apologized for the delay in creating a maintenance plan. The motion was approved 9 to 0.

New Business- SMSA was asked to host the Albacore National Championship Regatta over Columbus Day weekend, October 6-8. Gail Goode, who by coincidence has an Albacore, made a motion that SMSA host the regatta. Char Frost seconded. The motion was approved 9-0.

Announcements- Shawn extends his thanks to Dan Trammel and Stovy Brown for presenting the racing rules seminar, to Laura Comeau and Jeff Kumke for help with the race circular and to L.G. Raley for technical support and supplies. The first Wednesday night race is April 18; Sharp's Island Race is April 28; and the small boat kick-off meeting is on April 14.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:35 P.M.

RC Information. As part of RC duties for any race we conduct under the PHRF handicapping system, we should check for each boat's current valid rating. (Ratings do not always stay the same throughout the year.) While all racers in our big

boat race series are required to submit a copy of their PHRF Valid Certificate with the race entry form, the certificates are not always available to the RC. The RC or others who may be interested may, prior to the race, now access the latest listing of PHRF valid ratings on-line. Go to www.phrfchesbay.com to find the list that has the current ratings for all PHRF boats on the Bay. The list is updated each week, and may be printed easily for your reference. If, during check in, you don't find a racer on the list, consult the Special Sailing Instruction and section 4 of the General Sailing Instructions. Notify the skipper that you don't have a rating on file. There should be PHRF rating applications on board the RC boat if necessary.

Oxford Boatyard: Slips available at \$1.50/ft. \$4 for 30 amps, \$10 for 50 amps. No minimum number of days. Phone is (410) 226-5101, ask for the ship store. **Mention that you are with the SMSA cruise.**

Crockett Brothers: Slips available at \$1.58/ft. (with Boat US discount), \$2.10/ft. without. \$3 for 30 amps, \$5 for 50 amps. No minimum number of days. Phone is (410) 226-5113, ask for Bliss in the ship's store. **Mention that you are with the SMSA cruise.**

We will arrange for a cocktail hour on Saturday evening beginning around 5:30 p.m. at the Oxford Boatyard's new dock, and some cruisers will certainly want to eat out afterwards at one of Oxford's excellent restaurants. The wonderful annual Art Show at the Oxford Community Center is just one reason to be in Oxford on Memorial Day Weekend. Strawberry lovers will want to go to the Community Center for the homemade strawberry shortcake, even if you don't plan to attend the art show. TWO-WEEK CRUISE

Greetings to the two-week cruisers. The schedule is still as published in the yearbook. If you are interested in going, and have not made slip reservations at Cape May and Havre de Grace, I urge you to do so very soon. At Cape May, Utchs Marina is recommended and their phone number is (609) 884-2051. Utchs' policy on cancellation is as

follows: cancellation 10 days before scheduled arrival is accepted. Cancellation less than 10 days before scheduled arrival gives you credit for a slip later in the season. They are very close to the Lobster House Restaurant, which is highly recommended. Utchs Marina is where those who have made reservations plan to stay. They have a few bicycles to rent and are located a little over a mile from town but there is also shuttle bus service (a good way to tour the town.) Their rate is \$1.50/ft. including water and electricity. South Jersey Marina is an alternate choice and their number is (609) 884-2400. At Havre de Grace, we plan to stay at Tidewater Marina and their number is (800) 960-8433, extension 7 for the dockmaster. Their rate is \$1.00/ft. plus \$6.00/day for 30-amp. Be sure to mention that you are with SMSA when making reservations. At Chesapeake City, the plan is to anchor in the basin on the south side both ways. There will be more information in the next issue of *The Clew* and any suggestions for stops or activities will be most welcome.

LABOR DAY CRUISE

THE RACERS EDGE

It's late April and another SMSA fun-filled Wednesday Night Race series has begun! Your world famous (infamous?) boat, PEDAL TO THE METAL, has fresh bottom paint, fresh hull wax, and just out of the bag new sails ... so you are ready for the sailing season. You fully expect to finally clobber your archrival Poulet Poop and his scurvy crew aboard WEE WILLIE.

A moderate 8 to 10 knot easterly breeze greets you and the remainder of your fleet as everyone reaches away from the starting line toward "V" Mark. Your boat speed as expected is greater than WEE WILLIE's so you round "V" Mark to port and head toward the windward "A" Mark several boat lengths ahead. You decide to stay close to the South shore of the Patuxent so you short tack toward "A" Mark. Meanwhile WEE WILLIE charges out into the Patuxent (looking for an east flowing current?) and stays on a long starboard tack.

As both boats converge in the vicinity of "A" Mark, you are chagrined to discover that WEE WILLIE has closed the gap, and you and WEE WILLIE are now neck and neck as you approach the mark. WEE WILLIE however is on port tack and you are on starboard tack as you both converge so you quickly decide to "go hunting." As WEE WILLIE slowly maneuvers to his leeward to stay clear of you, you alter your course to your leeward to create a problem for WEE WILLIE. Poulet Poop sees you as you pull your tiller to weather in order to

maneuver to leeward, so WEE WILLIE immediately tacks to a safe lee starboard tack and shouts, "Protest!"

Since you successfully went hunting several times last summer, you are convinced you have nothing to fear from the Protest. You confidently go to the Protest hearing, confess to "hunting," and are immediately disqualified! Why?

The new ISAF rules for 2001 - 2004 have a new rule that outlaws "hunting." Rule 16.2, when crossing on opposite tacks, requires a starboard tack boat to not change course if as a result the port tack boat must immediately change course to continue to keep clear. Since WEE WILLIE was clever enough to immediately tack, and you admitted to "hunting", the Protest committee decided you were in violation of the new Rule 16.2. So you lose again and begin the new season just as the last one ended ... with a DSQ! Bummer.

This new rule is obviously intended to prevent "hunting" by right of way boats, and is another attempt to make racing safer for all participants. If you had only attended the SMSA racing rule seminar in early April (as many racing sailors did) you would have learned this new rule and known its impact on tactics. Oh well, live and learn ... the hard way.
