A bi-product of an assessment would be continued progress toward improving our member/non-member ratio of income to solidify our status as a non-profit 501c(7) organization.

As the guy who writes the checks to pay the bills and also closely watches the income and expenses versus the plan, I am in awe of the amount of activity that takes place over the course of the year in our club, as well as the dedication that your Governors demonstrate in administering their respective programs. Our club is a fun organization to be a part of and we have great folks participating in our activities. I am happy to take part as a member, sailor, and treasurer; and look forward to next year's activities... on the water and off.
