RACING

By the time you read this, the SMSA 2005 Racing Season will be upon us! That was a pretty short off-season, thankfully!

On February 17th the Race Governor Committee held a meeting at the SMSA Clubhouse at which about 40 of our club's interested racers attended. There was a lot of lively discussion, great feedback and interaction, and several changes to the Wednesday Night Racing Program were decided upon. The topics and results of the meeting are summarized below:

- (1) The Wednesday Night Race Program will be divided into first and second half seasons. The first half will run 10 races (April 20 – June 10)... the second half will also be 10 races (29 June-7 Sep). [The last Wednesday Night Race, September 14, will be raced normally. But will not be scored as part of the series.] Weekly awards (Zahniser's glasses) will be awarded for the top three finishers in each division, as has been done in the recent past (depending on numbers of boats). For series awards, each half will be scored separately using high-point method. There will be two throw-outs per half season. We will discontinue the rolling three-second PHRF subtraction for winning glasses. We will continue the two-second PHRF allowance for performing RC duty. The last Wednesday Night Race (#21) will be held on September 14th (not scored as part of the series). On that night, at the post-race results at Zahniser's Pool Bar, trophies for the first and second half of the Wednesday Night Series will be awarded.
- (2) For Wednesday Night Racing, participating boats will be divided into three divisions... White, Blue, Yellow. The division splits will be based on a banding based on Sail

Area/Displacement Ratio... SA/D. The splits will be announced via multiple means prior to the first Wednesday night race. Spinnaker AND Non-Spinnaker boats will race against (and be scored against) each other as split into the three divisions. Boats choosing to race non-spinnaker shall declare such intentions verbally to the RC at check-in, as well as flying the #5 pennant from the backstay. A PHRF allowance will be added to the ratings of those boats choosing to race non-spinnaker. This allowance (based on rig dimensions) is calculated by the RC Governor Committee using a conversion formula that has been proven to be effective in other clubs on the East Coast. Example: Smokin would receive a 16 second non-spin allowance, Kuggerand would get 22 seconds, and Slot Machine would receive 23 seconds. The combining of non-spin and spin boats will allow a tighter banding of racers and eliminate the problem of such wide rating spreads between participants (e.g., 48 seconds vs. 192 seconds). It was agreed that at the end of the first half of the season if the consensus among racers is that this new mixing of spin and non-spin boats is a bad idea, we will revert back to the old way for the second half of the season.

- (3) Stovy Brown volunteered to serve as coordinator and Principle Race Officer for four special Wednesday Night Races (race name TBD) that will be conducted under an enhanced Race Management format. Drop marks, windward-leeward courses, Mark Boat... a higher level of Race Management and organization. We will have two of these "enhanced" races the first half of the season, and two more the second half. Specific dates are yet to be determined. These four special races will be scored as a series, yet will also count in the scoring for the regular season two half-series (a

special series within a series, per se'). Trophies for this four-race series will be awarded at the post-race results party at the Zahniser's Pool Bar after the last Wednesday Night Race of the season... September 14th.

- (4) For Wednesday Night Racing, we decided to designate Fleet Captains (better term TBD) to serve on the race course as liaison and conduit from the racing fleet to the Race Committee. They shall be responsible to represent that night's racing fleet in communicating any race course or race management issues to the Race Committee. Communication shall be kept to a minimum and shall be conducted over VHF channel 72. Those individuals so designated are (1) Jeff Moore (Primary); (2) Shawn Stanley (Back-up); (3) Keith Jacobs (2nd Back-up). Only one Fleet Captain will be active on a night, depending on who is on the course.
- (5) Dan Schneider volunteered to research requirements that may exist with the US Coast Guard or DNR for placing additional fixed, seasonal race marks in the river, if we decide to do so.
- (6) Stovy Brown volunteered to chair a sub-committee (additional members: Dan Schneider, Norm Dawley, Shawn Stanley) to propose a configuration and process for dropping additional race marks at pre-designated locations during informal races. The purpose would be to promote better race course geometry/orientation depending on the wind direction (e.g., eliminating down wind starts).
- (7) Norm Dawley presented a brief overview and discussion on the new IRC rating rule that is gaining momentum across the U.S. [The Race

Governor will be attending the US-IRC seminar in Annapolis on February 26th]

- (8) Six more racers signed up to fulfill their obligation of serving their fellow racers by performing RC duty. There are still plenty of race dates to sign up for. Please do so soon. Note: Most critical needs, in the short term are: final Spring Frostbite Race... Sunday, April 3rd; Sharps Island Race... Saturday, April 23rd; Spring Invitational Race... Sunday, April 24th. The next open race, after those, is the Proctor-Bailey Series on Saturday, May 21st
- (9) Terry Wanner presented the reconditioned RC signal shotgun to the Race Governor, and asked that RC ensure the gun is oiled and wiped down after every race. Thank you, Terry, for your work in the cleaning and preservation of our shotgun.
- (10) The RC boat has been thoroughly cleaned and organized. Please do your part to keep it clean and organized. Keith Jacobs will hold an RC Boat training and familiarization session on Saturday, April 2nd immediately following Opening Day ceremonies. Pete LaRoche has volunteered to once again serve as our RC Boat Captain. The RC Boat has a new VHF radio, windlass, wind machine, GPS and depth sounder. Please help to keep all this new equipment in good shape.

And, once more on RC duty... we still have several races that do not have RC duty volunteers. If you have not signed up yet, please pick a race(s) and do so (sign-ups to me at williwaw66@hotmail.com please). The success of our racing program depends on EVERYONE who races to take their turn in the barrel with RC duty at least one race per season. [Besides, RC duty is fun!] The racing schedule is posted in the SMSA website www.SMSA.com. Thanks to all who have signed up early!

Note the change to the schedule for the 4th Spring Frostbite Race. Due to the early date for Easter Sunday this year, we slid the previously scheduled 4th Frostbite race from March 27th (Easter) to the 3rd of April.

We held a cleaning and prep day on the RC boat on February 13th. Tom Vandenberg, Keith Jacobs, and I did a thorough cleaning and organization job on the smelly mess in the RC boat cabin. [Thanks much TV and Keith!] We got rid of the mildew, replaced much of the old ratty stuff that had accumulated over years, and stowed the RC equipment put back in its place. As you perform RC duty this year, you'll also be pleased to see some new equipment that we've acquired over the off-season... new windlass, VHF radio, GPS, wind machine, and depth sounder. Please do your part to keep the "Rock Catcher" clean and organized. On Opening Day (April 2nd), Keith Jacobs will hold an RC boat familiarization session, immediately following opening ceremonies. Lastly, I want to thank Pete LaRoche for volunteering, once again, to serve as the *RC Boat Captain* this season.

Small Boat Program Update

Having concluded a successful 2004 season, the Small Boat Program is already gearing-up for 2005. The new year promises to be a busy one with 18 weeks of Thursday night racing, an informal One - Day Regatta, and our 9th Annual Invitational Regatta. We have also signed up to run the big boat Patuxent River Regatta on Sunday, August 14th. So, big boaters be ready – we are planning short courses with Portsmouth handicap (time-on-time) scoring.

The annual Kickoff Meeting is scheduled on Saturday, April 16th, at the SMSA Clubhouse; the meeting will begin at 1pm. We will discuss registration and scheduling for the upcoming season. Light snacks and refreshments will be provided. We invite all competitors or anyone interested in helping with race committee to attend. Also, if you are looking to crew, this will be a great opportunity to begin to find a skipper to race with.

The 2005 schedule is presented here:

May 5	Thursday Night Racing Begins
June 25	One-Day Small Boat Regatta
Sept. 1	Thursday Night Racing Concludes
Sept 24-25	9 th Annual Small Boat Invitational

The Small Boat Program welcomes any monohull (centerboard) or catamaran ranging from 8 to 21 feet in length to join us. Thursday night racing typically runs off the Solomons boardwalk, beginning at 6:30 pm.

Additionally, we have agreed to host the 2005 Albacore United States Nationals. We expect approximately 40 competitors for this event, with many just returning from their international championships (to be held in southwest England). Racers will begin to arrive on Friday, October 7, with racing scheduled for the next three days, October 8-10.

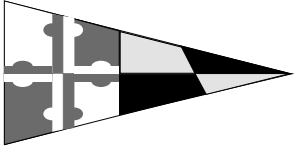
