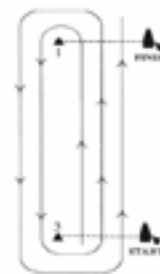

Norm and his wife Rosemary joined SMSA in February, 1996, almost exactly 16 years ago. During Norm's career he worked for a small aero-space company, then IBM and Prodigy, starting in Santa Barbara, California, then spending 6 wonderful years in Kaneohe, Hawaii, and lastly Wilton, Connecticut. On a visit with Stovy and Anne Browne, Norm and Rosemary fell in love with Southern Maryland. When Norm retired, they moved to their dream house on the water on Leason Cove off Mill Creek and have been active Chesapeake Bay racers since then. Norm has "failed" retirement and now runs a small company which provides audit services for shipping departments.

Norm and Rosemary have owned *Pursuit* since she was launched in 1980. They have raced and cruised extensively: Nova Scotia, Maine, all of the Great Lakes (except Superior), the Puget Sound, the Hawaiian Islands, and Southern California as well as Narragansett Bay, Long Island Sound, Chesapeake Bay and Bermuda. Favorite harbors outside of the Chesapeake to which they would like to return are Baddeck in Nova Scotia's Bras d'Or Lakes; Watch Hill, RI (when *Pursuit* loses that extra foot of draft or they dredge the channel); Lady's Harbor on Santa Cruz Island, California; and Hanalei Bay on Kauai. Norm's all-time favorite race is the Transpac from Los Angeles to Honolulu which he has sailed seven times.

Keelboat Race Audibles

Happy New Year to all who are in the midst of either prepping our boats for the upcoming race season or pursuing other interests during the off-season (e.g. skiing which is why I had to reschedule our race planning meeting). There are a couple of topics I'd like to put up for discussion and get a consensus for this year's race activities.



- While keeping the same general race weekend schedule as we had last year, we are switching around WHICH middle distance race happens on the schedule dates. Giving different sailing conditions to the same race could make long-standing race events even more interesting. What are your thoughts?
- There was a good turnout for the mixed couples race as an "all call" to small boats, keelboats and cruisers. If we add another event to the schedule, what is the likelihood of your participation?
- I propose we do away with PRO races on Weds Nights and have 2 informal series of "round the cans" racing which is better suited for the larger majority of boats and crews. If we have at least 50% participant agreement, we will remove PRO series from the schedule.
- What is the general consensus on starting Weds night by the flats instead of near the boardwalk? Do we stay as last year for 2012 or go back to the boardwalk starts?
- Based on my first experience in recovering "E" (and "S") at the end of the 2012 season which is very hard on the RC boat, I propose to salvage the big buoy and move/re-label "S" as "E" with a cement filled bucket vs engine block. I also propose to purchase 2 new Taylor Made race marks (the same as V and K) one to replace "S" in front of the boardwalk and the other to replace "T" near the flats (as it has been sinking steadily)
- How does everyone feel about the glass and pewter awards selected (by the Vice Commodore) for the 2011 winners?
- There were some rumblings about the duration for announcing and distributing keelboat race awards at the awards banquet. How would you feel about informal awards presentation at the end of each series or event and included in the awards banquet documentation but not formally presented at the event?

Please send me emails with other topics to discuss and I will publish an AGENDA and a longer write up for the March Clew's Audibles Column. The meeting is now scheduled for, Sunday, March 4th at 4 PM.

March is Cajun Time

Commodore Yurko has thrown down the challenge for March, Cajun food! As this style of food is not readily found in Southern Maryland, here is some background:

Cajun is the style of cooking named for the French-speaking Acadian or "Cajun" immigrants deported by the British from Acadia in Canada to the Acadiana region of Louisiana, USA. It is what could be called a rustic cuisine — locally available ingredients predominate, and preparation is simple.











An authentic Cajun meal is usually a three-pot affair, with one pot dedicated to the main dish, one dedicated to steamed rice, special made sausages, or some other seafood dish, and the third containing whatever vegetable is plentiful or available. Ground Cayenne & Fresh Black Pepper are used often.



This should be a grand feast!

Joe Kubinec - Member of the Year

Five years ago SMSA was a very happy club housed in a small clubhouse located on the property of Calvert Marina. As it does today, the club had strong racing and cruising programs. There weren't the facilities for a robust Junior program. The social program was good, but not as extensive as today's program. Dues were very low and life was good. Joe Kubinec became Treasurer.

The Treasurer's job is a tough job. SMSA is an all-volunteer organization. Joe made some significant improvements. He modified a highly complex budget forecasting and tracking tool which was developed for a business he owned, commonly referred to as the budget model, to track SMSA's financial performance. He greatly expanded financial communications to the BOD, Chairs and general membership.

Not too long after Joe became Treasurer the fun started. The owners of the Calvert clubhouse property decided to develop the property, forcing SMSA to find a new home. The Treasurer's job increased dramatically. A new property for a clubhouse had to be found. There was no chance that an almost rent free offering would be available. The impact of the increase in clubhouse rental had to be evaluated. Dues had to be increased as in line with the increase in rent. Dramatic increases in dues tend to irritate members. Joe worked very hard to communicate to the members as clearly as possible the ins and outs of club finances. His work helped keep the club together.



Unable to attend the Annual Banquet, Joe was honored at the Board of Director's meeting on January 9th.

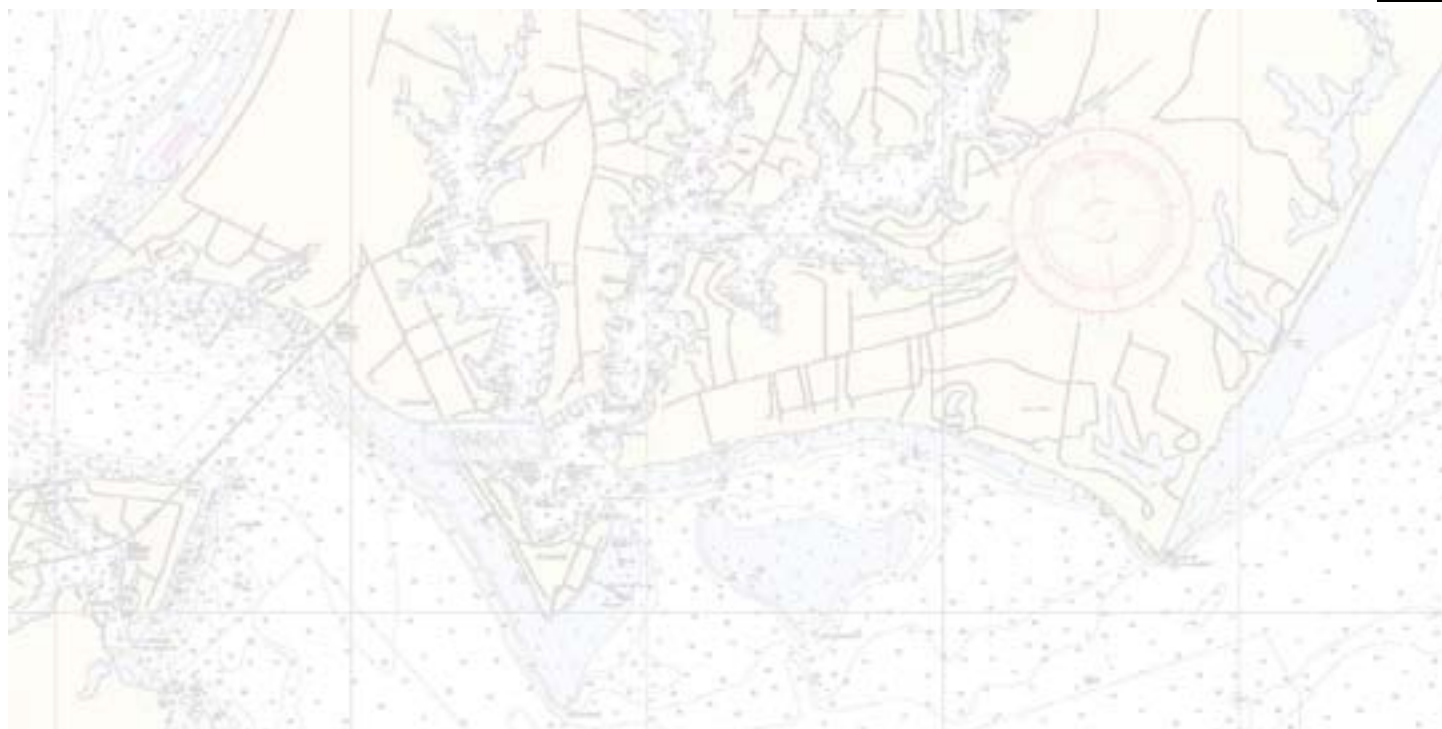
The new clubhouse, while much more expensive, also brought new benefits: a healthy and growing small boat race program fueled by convenient boat storage facilities, a growing robust Junior program and an enhanced social program. All of these are great for the members, but they forced more work on the Treasurer.

A member usually serves as Treasurer no more than two years. When the time came for Joe to step down and turn the job over to another, he was asked each year to keep doing the job because it was now so big and complex no other member could do it. Joe, being Joe, stayed on. It became a second almost full time job, but one without pay. What's worse, Joe who joined the club because he loved to sail found himself with very little time to sail. Finally, he decided that completing five years of service in 2011 was enough. It really is wonderful that the members honored Joe's service by voting him member of the year.
