It was a great weekend enjoyed by all.



Solomons Island Yacht Club (SIYC) - Invitation to the Blessing of the Fleet

The annual Blessing of the Fleet ceremony, organized by Solomons Island Yacht Club (SIYC) will take place on Sunday, May 15, between 2 and 4 PM. All SMSA members are invited to bring their sailboats and participate in this annual event.

Boats will gather at Sandy Point near red marker 6A and proceed north in the Patuxent River along the boardwalk where the M/V Turtle Island will be anchored about 100 yards off the shore and where the SIYC Fleet Chaplain will be stationed to bless each boat and its captain as they pass by. The participating boats will then proceed a bit further up river to the anchored M/V Tennyson from the Calvert Marine Museum before the bridge where the present and past senior officers of SIYC will be on board and dressed in white unforms, who will salute every boat that passes by.

This parade of boats will be led by the Sea Tow vessel with a flashing light and supported by 1-2 DNR boats and perhaps a Coast Guard or Coast Guard Auxiliary boat. At that point, the ceremony will be over and the boats will individually turn to port and return to their home ports.


