You are invited to a party at SMSA, a party about coming of spring!

As winter slowly fades away and the days becomes longer, the Southern Maryland Sailing Association (SMSA) eagerly anticipates the arrival of the Spring Equinox. This marks the beginning of the racing season, and what better way to celebrate this occasion than by participating in the Sock Burning tradition, which is observed annually and originated in nearby Eastport, MD. The Burning of the Socks has its roots in the boating community, and it serves as a

symbolic way to shed the old and welcome in the new. Sailors in Eastport, MD have been participating in this tradition for decades, and it has since become a popular regional event that draws in locals and visitors alike.

For the members of the SMSA, the Sock Burning marks the start of the racing season and signals the beginning of an exciting time for sailors in the area. As temperatures rise, boats are launched back into the water, and sailors prepare for the upcoming races and regattas throughout the region. To celebrate the arrival of spring and the start of the racing season, SMSA is organizing a party and sock burning gathering to be held in the club boatyard. Members and friends of members are invited to come and participate in this tradition, which is sure to be a fun and memorable experience.

The event will be held on the day of the vernal or spring equinox which this year falls on March 20th and is astronomically official at 5:24PM. The vernal equinox marks the sun's crossing above the Earth's equator, moving from south to north. It will involve gathering around a bonfire and burning old socks (cotton, bamboo, or wool only please) in celebration of the new season. Participants are encouraged to wear boat shoes or sandals and bring a clean sock, symbolizing their readiness for the upcoming races. You may be booed for choosing a sock you are wearing but it is traditional and is an accepted practice.

The Sock Burning is a fun and meaningful way to celebrate the arrival of spring and the start of the racing season. For many sailors across the Bay and further afield, it holds a special place in their hearts and marks an important milestone in the sailing calendar. So, mark the date and join us in the SMSA boatyard on March 20th at 4PM for a fun-filled evening of burning socks and celebration!

There will be a list of food choices to bring that will be sent out in the email announcement. Please assist with the catering by bringing one item and help everyone enjoy the coming of spring.



2023 SUMMER SAILING CAMP OPPORTUNITIES

Camp Director & Instructors

The club has job openings for a Sailing Camp Director and for Instructors for the summer of 2023.

Camp Director: The camp director needs to be <u>at least 21 years of age</u> and be able to go out daily on the water with the students and instructors. The director does not have to be a sailing instructor, but if capable, that is an advantage for the campers and SMSA. The director needs to learn to operate the SMSA safety boats and is responsible for the daily operations and management of the camp and its personnel. The director would work with and be trained by the SMSA Junior Chair. In the past, retirees, teachers, and college student sailors have all held the position.

Instructors: Instructors supervise and teach the students on land and on water. Instructors need to enjoy working with children and be good communicators. Instructors must be <u>at least 16 years old</u>, be seasoned dinghy sailors, competent in operation of powerboats, and eligible to obtain a US Sailing Level I Small Boat Instructor Certification. SMSA will be hosting an instructor class prior to the summer season to assist in instructor certification.




entertain any questions along the way and any examples you bring to share with the forum.

CRUISERS CORNER

Cruisers,

Its late Feb so only 6-8 weeks to go – hope all the boat jobs are in progress and you get to splash early. Our first cruise is a shakedown up the Pax to Rollins Cove scheduled for the weekend of April 22nd and 23rd.

That one doesn't involve making reservations but when we get the schedule published on the website soon you'll all need to figure out which cruises you're going on and make associated marina reservations. It's a bit like flying post pandemic – all of them will be busy so its first come first served.

Your cruise leader should have at least alerted the marinas that there will be a SMSA cruise group arriving on specific dates. However it up to you individually to make your own reservations. Some do it directly, some use Snag-a-Slip or Dockwa. All will need boat name, LOA, Draft, and beam plus power requirements. Most will take a credit card for a 1 night deposit but pay attention to their cancellation policy. If you cancel later do so before their cancellation deadline which you should put in your calendar. Most are 2-3 days before arrival date otherwise you lose your deposit or even get charged for the whole stay. If it's a holiday then that could be expensive.

Before you get on the water evening time occupational therapy should be doing the following:

- 1. Do your own reading about the locations using cruise guides and such,
- 2. Checkyour charts for any navigation or draft issues
- 3. Update your Chartplotter, and
- 4. Add routes and waypoints for cruises.

Weather will be something to check closer to the actual dates. Remember - a cruise plan is a plan and Plans Change so stay alert for updates and possible weather related modifiers.

For your consideration: The Wye River Cruise is still in the planning stages but SMSA will be able to join the EYC Memorial Weekend get together under the auspices of the

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Chesapeake Bristol Club of which Randy and Warna Gilles are members and who are our cruise leaders. The EYC program specifics are not yet published but check https://www.eastportyc.org/wye-island for updates. Please don't call/email the organizer contacts as we will inform you of how we need to handle this. Likely there's a reservation needed, a paid Pavilion BBQ dinner (~\$50/head), various gatherings, races, and activities for both kids and adults. Dogs are allowed but leashed. People are also encouraged to arrive by land. The overall plan (based on 2022 flyer) is arrive Sat early pm, with an informal get together Sat evening. Sunday is races and adult/kid games, and the BBQ dinner. Monday is head home.

Cruising to me is a social activity with some sailing involved. Most cruisers love interfacing with other cruisers using their shared experiences so I recommend we should participate and build our shared interest resource group. Who knows you may end up with more lifelong friends. If this isn't to your liking, our cruiser directions allow 2 or more cruisers to choose to go to somewhere nearby and still get points. We can use this to have an alternate less involved one.

How is it March Already? Some of you are already back on the water and enjoying the mild winter weather; others of you are finishing up your off season boat projects; and still others of us are trying to figure out how to get everything completed to kick-off the season!

Keelboat registration (i.e. race fees) is LIVE on the website. All boats (old and new) will need to sign-up. (https://www.smsa.com/Race/KBRace_2023.php & select "Season Registration). If a boat is on the installment plan for race fees or if they want to register their boat for a second fleet (ex: Non-spin and B-fleet), go to the Member Login area of the SMSA Website (https://southernmarylandsailingassociation.theclubspot.com/member-coupons) to get a Discount code so you only have to pay race fees once.

On February 18th we held a follow-up keelboat participants meeting which started at 0900 and lasted until about 1330. Many folks showed up in person while a couple folks joined via Zoom. Thank you all for your time and input. The following things were solidified and will show-up in the 2023 SI's once they are finished:

Invitationals:

- Moving the times from 1100 to 1300
- Changing the racing fees from \$45 to only \$25 since we are not hosting any post race events and are looking to increase outside participation.
- Granting a request by CRCA to compete using ORR-ez certificates. This will be a new fleet with an independent start if there are more than 5 boats signed up for this fleet.

Frost Goode:

- Allowing for self timed finishes, thus removing the time limit for RC to be on station.
- Changing the top mark to be 3 boat length distance and magnetic bearing to mark before turning around, instead of having to sail around the mark due to shallow water.

Middle Distance Races:

• Will retain formal starting sequence run by RC boat (no self starting)

Mixed Couples:

• The Mixed Couples will remain a mixed couples fun race associated with the cruis-Continued on page 14 ing event, instead of becoming a "Crew of 2".

Once all that was nailed down the remaining several hours were spent in discussion on PRHF vs VPP based Handicapping systems (ORR-ez). Mark Witte, Jim Whited, and Dan Trammell all presented some work they have done in the background showing pro's/con's, what, how, and why. In the end, it was decided that a survey would be put out to past, current and future racing participants and held open until 25 Feb. Results are not available at this time, but keelboat racing leadership is going to look into how to most expeditiously and cost effectively implement any changes that are desired by the community. Much more to come on this topic.

Looking for volunteers to help with:

Wednesday night "chalk talks" following the races – While reading of the results, each of the top crews will share some of the wisdom/ tactics/ strategies used during the race. Anything from prestart, wind shifts, currents, to maneuvering and keeping moving in light air. This is to encourage learning and development within the SMSA racing body.

Friday Happy Hour Shore Race Training and Crew Join-up – Once a month, Friday happy hours will include a bit on racing training. We would like skippers to come and show support to the "newbies" and invite them to your programs, as well as share some of your wisdom on the topic of the evening. (who, what, how yet to be worked out)

Crew Member Join-up - increasing the number of crew joining events from just the one in April.

Upcoming Events:

- March 3, 4, 5, 2023: Racing Mark Deployment Depending weather, the floating marks (K, L, T & V) will be placed back into the water with new ground tackle and concrete moorings. Welcome to join Erick on RC boat.
- March 11th, 2023: Rules Review for those who want to refresh the rules of racing (RRS 2021 thru 2024), we are going to ask our resident Judge to come and give brief, followed by a discussion. (See page 8 for details)
- March 12th, 2023: Frostbite #1 Kicking off the racing season with frostbites on Sundays. Rakali is first up for RC, and are planning to run it from the shore. If you're not going to race, come watch from RC at the end of Solomon's... I hear it's a good tailgate party!
- April 1st, 2023: Race Committee Operations and Boat Procedures For
 those who have not been on RC before, or those whom it's been a while, we are
 going to have an afternoon to review the Operations and running of Race committee, as well as go over all the RC Boat operations and procedures. Depending on
 participation and need, this may also turn into a RC Boat check-out for those who
 want to drive the RC Boat when it's you crews turn to run RC.

SMSA Keelboat Racing Survey Results

25 Responses Received

Thanks to everyone that came out to the keelboat meetings and those that participated in the survey. It's great to see the passion that exists among our racers. I know that there are strong opinions when it comes to the scoring system used for our races. There was some very good discussion on the subject during the two meetings. As promised, we conducted a survey that was open to all past, present, and potential future racers. The below graphs show the results of the three most relevant questions.


Roughly half the club said that they had no opinion or the scoring system didn't matter to them. There were almost an equal number that believed that we should keep PHRF scoring, as thought the system needs to be changed (24% to 28%).

Just over 75% of the respondents said that the scoring system would not affect whether they would race or not. Of those that the scoring system would affect whether or not they would race, a change away from PHRF would potentially take more boats off the line.

The Keelboat Chair and I will discuss the results and make a determination on what if any changes will be made for the upcoming season. Again, thanks to all for your thoughts and ideas.


Robert Beckman
