

<u>March 2nd at 11:00 AM</u>. The seminar will go to 2:30

PM with a half-hour break at about 12:30. All skippers and crews are invited.

Dan will cover the rules using examples and how they apply to each situation. Definitions, starting area, upwind sailing, windward mark roundings, reaching, downwind sailing, leeward mark roundings, upwind finishes and downwind finishes will all be covered. The focus will primarily be on Part 2 of the RRS. Dan will


entertain any questions along the way and any examples you bring to

Dan is a certified US Sailing National Judge and has lectured extensively (CBYRA and member clubs) on the racing rules. He regularly lectures and coaches the Midshipmen of the US Naval Academy's Varsity Offshore Sailing Team on the racing rules.

Preparations are underway for the new calendar year. A new anchor has been made for replacement as well as the anchor created last year in memory of Brian Steuart. Both will be used this year while setting marks. I will be spending the next couple weekends getting the marks ready for the new year. New paint, new wrapping, and new ground tackle installed.

### **HELP Needed:**

- I will need someone to assist with placing Racing marks this spring prior to the first race on March 3rd. I will be out of the country yet again.
- I will also welcome some assistance with preparing the marks over the next few weekends. Please reach out if you are willing to help out.

I have been asking for the last few months for inputs for improving the racing at SMSA. I have not received any comments other then the following suggestions which will be discussed at the Pre-Season Meeting:

- Independent J/70 class this will reduce the B fleet significantly, but will result in one design competition. More thoughts and impacts to follow.
- Changing from PHRF class designation to SMSA determined class designation. This will allow SMSA to size the fleets based on the number of participants making for even numbers of boats per class, but may make boats previously in a fast fleet, now dominate a slower fleet. More discussion to follow.

But our 32nd annual Screwpile will be here before we know it. So, our Screwpile Planning Committee is already hard at work with the myriad of tasks that it takes to produce SMSA's signature regatta. There's still lots of work to do, but for now... the Screwpile website has been updated <a href="http://screwpile.net">http://screwpile.net</a>, and the Yacht Scoring website is available and is ready for registrations (<a href="https://yachtscoring.com/emenu.cfm">https://yachtscoring.com/emenu.cfm</a>?

<u>eID=16375</u>). The March SpinSheet ad is in development. The barrage of FaceBook posts have started at <a href="https://www.facebook.com/SplcRegatta">https://www.facebook.com/SplcRegatta</a> (please feel free to share!). And, sponsors have been lined up for another year of support.

Yes it's early. But, I urge ALL SMSA racers and cruiser/racers to go ahead and register NOW so we can show Bay racers that we are supporting our own regatta. A Yacht Scoring scratch sheet that is filling up is always a magnet for more registrations. You can register now and pay later. And by the way... now is the time to start talking up Screwpile with your friends at other clubs.

Again this year, Screwpile will host the PHRF of the Chesapeake Mid-Bay Champion-ships. In addition to Screwpile daily's and overall awards for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place finishes, PHRF championship trophies will be awarded for overall top three places on Sunday. Hopefully the PHRF Championships will catch on and start to attract more racers.

The Notice of Race is posted in Yacht Scoring. The regatta is open to PHRF classes (A0/A1, A2, B, C), One-Design, and CRCA Spinnaker and CRCA Non-Spinnaker cruisers. The CRCA Non-Spin Cruisers who also have a PHRF Cruising Certificate will be dual scored and be eligible for Screwpile CRCA and PHRF trophies. So, if you are racing in the CRCA Non-Spin Class, ensure you also have a current PHRF Cruising rating in addtion to your CRCA certificate. As noted in the January CLEW, the former Holiday Inn, which is now the Solomons Inn Resort & Marina is currently under renovation. The great news for Screwpile out-of-town racers is that the original plan to turn the hotel into an assisted living facility has been scrapped. Upon completion of the renovation, it will serve as a full service HOTEL with the 350 rooms being split between traditional hotel rooms and extended stay hotel rooms. 
