Member Protocols During Sailing Camp

SMSA operates certain youth sailing summer camps, during which camps the safety and security of youth campers must be of paramount importance. During these youth summer camps, it is recognized that SMSA members may need or desire to be on the SMSA property together with the youth campers. In order to ensure that proper protocols are in place to ensure camper safety, following are the procedures which should be followed by all SMSA members (and any accompanied guests) who are on the SMSA property during the hours of sailing camp:

- 1. All SMSA members shall check in with the camp Director immediately upon entering any part of the SMSA Clubhouse and surrounding property. The Director shall have access to a current SMSA membership roster and will verify the member's current membership status.
- 2. All SMSA members shall, to the fullest reasonable extent, stay clear of all campers and camp activities.
- 3. All SMSA members shall have no contact or interaction with any camper.
- 4. All SMSA members shall use the restroom facility inside the main front room of the clubhouse, which are off limits to campers.
- 5. All SMSA members who may need to enter the small boat equipment and sail storage area and rows D and E (Laser Storage Area) shall first coordinate with the camp Director.
- 6. The T-Head is closed from 9:00 a.m. 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, while camps are in session.

Your Safety Boat Captain (Randy Gross) is seeking Cruisers, Keelboat crew, and other club members interested in becoming Safety/Mark Boat drivers and/or crew.

The Safety/Mark boat's primary purpose is to:

- Render assistance to any sailor who may capsize/ turtle their boat or have any other breakdowns
- Support the race committee by moving marks
- Towing boats back into the harbor when the wind dies or boats have equipment issues and can't sail in on their own

Drivers: experienced with operating small outboard boats is desired, but training is available if you are interested in volunteering.

Safety Boat Crew: ability to safely walk around on a small boat, is the only requirement, though being able to pull up and deploy the mark anchors is a plus.

Now is a good time to learn these skillsets in preparation to help with the Fall Smallboat Invitational, a 2-day event. You can practice these skills during Thursday night Smallboat Racing

What you need to know for the St. Mary's and 4th of July Picnic Cruise with Cruise Leaders Carl and Martha Kemp!

Day 1 - Jul 4, '25

Sail south to Potomac, then St. Mary's River. Anchor in St. Mary's at Horseshoe Bend. Opportunity to Dinghy ashore for Independence Day Concert by Chesapeake Orchestra, at St. Mary's College (7-9pm); or stay on boat and listen to concert. If going ashore take a chair. Food trucks are available on shore. Gather on the left side of the concert grounds (facing the stage).

This is a large anchorage area and gets busy before the event, plan to get there early.

Day 2 - Jul 5, '25

This is the picnic day – it takes place around 3:00pm. It will be at Price's Cove or on the grounds of St. Mary's College at the sailing building, depending on weather. Spend the morning sailing or walking ashore to explore the college campus. Dinghy ashore to the picnic on the beach. Bring steaks, chicken, dogs or whatever you prefer to throw on the grill and a side, appetizer or dessert to share. (If we go to Price's Cove, sail out St Mary's River from Horseshoe Bend 4 nm to the entrance of St George Creek. Price Cove is to the north just after entering the creek.)

This anchorage is dependent on the weather and preferences. Messages will go out during cruise.

Day 3 - Jul 6 '25

Sunday is a lazy day. Sail, paddle board or kayak around the area, hike, or work on a project. If you want to stay at anchor, Smith Creek is nearby and has many spots to anchor that are a short dinghy ride to Pier 450 where we will meet at 4:00 for happy hour and dinner. Another option is to 'beat the heat' and reserve a slip at Point Lookout Marina. (301-872-5000).

Day 4 - Jul 7, '25


