



The high school sailing season is coming to a close, but October has been a great month of sailing! The team started out the month sailing in the SMSA Smallboat Invitational, with a 4-boat 420 fleet. Tommy Birchfield and Colt Touchton came in first place in the 420 fleet, with Nolan Wingate and his friend, Zephyr Dyro, coming in a close second. Following them was Max Wingate and Manu Schipper, and then Loundin Curtis and myself (Rebecca Wingate). Everyone had a great time on day 1 with no wind, with many raft ups, swimming, and frisbee between the boats, and then enjoyed day 2 with some races!

Our Tier 1 team qualified for the MDISA (Maryland Interscholastic Sailing Association) Fleet Championship hosted at Tred Avon Yacht Club in Oxford on October 11th-12th. Tommy and Nolan skippered with Joseph DiBonaventuro and Owen Myers as crew, and sailing against some tough competition, the team placed 15th out of 16 schools. Nolan placed 11th out of 16 in his division and his best race was a 3rd place! The second day of racing was cancelled due to high winds.

Next up was a Tier 3 regatta at St. Mary's Ryken on Saturday, October 18th. After a 1 hour delay with no wind, 6 races were sailed in both divisions. Max Wingate and Colt Touchton skippered with Beau Sink and Ryan Deibler as crew, and the team placed 4th out of 10 schools. Max, Beau, Colt, and Ryan all had several races in the top 3- way to go, sailors!

We will finish October out with a few more practices, a boat clean-up day, and a pizza party, before the Varsity and JV Championships the first weekend of November. More on those next time! As always, thanks for supporting this great group of sailors.
