Commodore's Corner

Members,

In the UK they use the phrase "The Queen is dead, long live the King". At the recent annual meeting you elected a new set of officers Commodore - Russell Miller, Vice Commodore-Randy Gross, Rear Commodore-Shane Myers, Treasurer-Kristi Yurko, and Secretary-Nicole Foveaux, and a couple of new directors Polly Traynham and Steve Burchfield. I congratulate all of the new and remaining board members and wish them well when they assume the SMSA reins in January.

In the interim, we have joint meetings where they are in attendance and learn about the items on our agenda, which currently focus on setting the budgets for the 2026 SMSA programs. At the November BoD meeting we set an overall target for next year as a starting point. We distributed 2025 account info to the chairs and asked them to come up with ideas and budget requirements for next year. We will then discuss these at the Dec BoD with some items making the cut and some not.

Our main source of income to service ownership debt and operationally run the club is membership dues. If we get too fancy on improvements which require increased income then membership numbers can suffer depending on the size of the increase. Personally, we all have had to deal with increasing costs and inflation on everything and SMSA is no different, suffering those same increase in costs. So the joint process is to come up with an affordable budget that can be approved and implemented by the new BoD, starting in January.

There's some additional tax and financial work to be done in the new year relative to our 2025 finances. We need to have a 3rd party financial review conducted which shows we're in good position but if any issues are found they can be quickly corrected. Likewise, as you all experience, SMSA has to file 2025 taxes at various stages in early 2026. The current and new treasurers have considerable work to do to get this completed.

My initial advice to our new Commodore was to poll all the current chairs

for their continued support. If changes to the chairs or the reporting structure need to be made, then it's important to get them on board asap since the Commodore nominates the chairs and gets approval for them at the January BoD.

Luckily we're about to conclude most club sailing activities, which gives us time to enjoy a busy holiday season of family, work and club events between Thanksgiving, Christmas and New Years. Just remember that the new and old BoD's work continues during that time so SMSA is properly setup for next year.

We hope you enjoyed your Thanksgiving and please don't forget to thank the many volunteers who make SMSA work.





