

## **Freeze Your Bucc Off! 2025**

For well over a decade now the SMSA Buccaneer fleet has been hitting the water in December to close out the year in style (what kind of style, we're not sure yet, but it's definitely a style).

Over the last few years we've opened the event to "similar" boats & crews. By which we mean...you've got sails right? Sixteen teams hit the water this December on what turned out to be a warm day, with sunshine and air temps in the low 40's, wind gusts into the mid teens and water that was still liquid in most of the area.

The regatta is designed for maximum action in minimal time. We know December sailing is challenging and digits get cold fast so racing begins and ends at the docks with minimal down time. Race 1 starts at noon at the docks, the "Last Race" ends at the bar, no time wasted on formalities. No Starts after 3pm so everyone can get back and catch the Army-Navy game. Fun from the go and until you're gone.



The first race of the series begins at the SMSA docks with RC sighting the line and sounding the starting signal from the T-Dock behind the clubhouse. It's a one way reach out to the river where the finish line is already set with RC on station just outside of the creek. How did they manage to start and finish in separate places? The world may never know. Today it was a reaching race, boats inches from one another most of the way, as the starting line is awfully short for 16 boats, and the narrow strip out of the harbor doesn't give much room for maneuvering. The wind most of the time shifting you

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from close hauled to beam reaches. Inches separate catching a lucky puff and pulling ahead or being left behind. The islands, docks and moored boats all create narrow channels and vortices for the wind. Each an opportunity to break free or be stuck.



Clarke McKinney & Scott Patterson (Bucc 5218) got an early lead with a great start off the line, and held firmly most of the way, giving up the lead just before reaching the docks by the "Rachel Carson" research vessel. They were not giving up that easily though, and took a surprisingly favorable lane by sailing tightly against the windward side of the channel somehow avoiding the wind shadow of the research facility docks, then maxing out boat speed on the final beam reach to the finish line securing the first win of any

race on this day.

Races 2-4 were short course two lap windward-leeward style races similar to SMSA's typical Thursday night races. Each lasting about 30 minutes, and adding the joy of some very cool water splashing at you. We had exciting conditions in the river as the gusts were in the mid teens most of the afternoon, with the 'light' races averaging over 9 knots of windspeed. Vladimir Eremeev *smoked* the fleet in races 2 and 3 with his newest hot rod "Super Sonic". Super Sonic is a Nacra F17 catamaran that he's been fitting out for an Everglades Challenge run this upcoming spring, so it was really great to see him out making it work so smoothly. Keep an eye out, he'll be hard to miss. I'm willing to bet it will be the only yellow beach cat solo sailing at 20+ knots across the river this winter. Mark Witte & Hali Kilbourne won race 4 putting it all together and showing what can happen when you simply sail smoothly (and faster).



I don't know how busy the RC was pouring hot chocolate that day, but I know our boat definitely took that pit stop before race 5 to recharge. My feet were getting numb since I left my waterproof socks at home and I was just starting to remember where this regatta got its name. Yes, RC had hot chocolate ready for racers. Preparation is key. (Thanks Kristi and Cora Yurko for making that happen)

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Race 5 is the "last race" and it's a real unique one. As the official start of the race is whenever your boat retires from all other racing for the day. The start line is wherever you are when you turn in, and the finish line is the bar at SMSA, where you have to place your hand before your competitors. Since the race 'starts' once you've retired from other racing for the day, the conventional RRS is out of the window. You still need to follow the basic rules of the road and avoid collisions, but there are

no marks to honor, no rule 42, just get back any way you can. It's a real race...it can make or break your chances at the prize for the day and many sprints across the gravel, down the road, from the neighboring docks and anywhere crews can get a foot ashore to gain advantage have been used as leverage to get in. This year's winner of the "last race" was John Herbig & Aaron Shiffer who made the wise decision to turn in after race 2 and get to dryer shores.



This year's overall winner of Freeze Your Bucc Off! is everyone who stayed home and kept warm. No -- scratch that -- we're excited to pass the major award over to Nolan Wingate and Bill Shoemaker who once again showed us that being fast is good, but being consistently fast is great. Nolan and Bill were never first across the line in the regatta, but consistently were at the top and kept it together sailing smart, and very fast. As a result they will have their name ~~forever engraved on a precious piece of sailing history~~ written in sharpie on an old chamber pot.



We've already scheduled the 2026 Freeze Your Bucc Off! for December 12, come join us it's definitely better than watching TV on a Saturday afternoon.
